



Targeted Supportmeans support for FEW children, who need an intervention or longer support

Developmental Flags for Review-

- No Babbling or other sounds by 12 months
- No pointing by 12 months
- No simple gestures by 12 months

1. When your child is 12 months the member of the 0-19 Team will reach out to you to arrange a meeting Healthy Child Programme when you can discuss your concerns.

- Not responding to speech and/or other sounds
- Minimal or not attempts to communicate
