### What we have achieved

In the zone has been delivered for the third year running to year 9 students in **16** mainstream secondary schools and **3 specialist provisions**. We estimate that we have reached **4000 young people** aged 13/14.

Young people have received sessions on the following topics;

- Knife crime Youth Justice Service
- Drugs and Alcohol Response
- Peer Pressure Detached youth
- Cyber safety Safer school's police
- Child exploitation Compass

















#### In the Zone – staying safe online and offline

Year 9 students took part in a series of workshops called In the Zone, aimed at prompting discussion and giving them information and skills that will help them stay safe in the community. The topics covered included knife crime, criminal exploitation, peer pressure, cyber safety, and drugs and alcohol. 







## Feedback from the young people

Now you have completed the session, let's look at the star below again. Can you tell us how much (from 1 to 5) you think you **now know** about the 5 subjects.




What is one thing you have learned from the sessions today?

## Feedback from the young people

- 87% of young people have shown an increase in knowledge following the sessions.
- From a sample of feedback forms 82% did not feel that anything in the sessions needed to change
- Students that identified that they would change something about the session suggested the following;
  - More interactive (games)
  - Sessions could be longer to enable more discussion

### **Feedback from staff**

Delivering in the zone has raised the profile of the detached youth team amongst young people and has helped build relationships.

Young people see me in the community and recognise us from the sessions that we have delivered in their school.

Delivering in the zone has enabled us to increase young people's knowledge on the impact of substance misuse, particularly the effects of Ketamine.

The students have engaged so well in the sessions, it is great to be involved in preventative work increasing young people's knowledge and understanding around the effects of knife crime.

## **Moving forward**

 For the upcoming academic year, we have 16 mainstream secondary schools, and 5 specialist provisions confirmed. This is an increase on previous years as we extend the offer to targeted specialist provisions and alternative provisions.

> Service areas are reviewing and updating the sessions that are delivered to ensure that information shared is relevant and up-todate.

> > We have more staff on-board to assist with the delivery of the sessions.

 Other local areas e.g. St. Helens have observed the sessions and are hoping to set up similar programmes in their areas.
