The network is a peer-led learning and problem-solving network designed to strengthen voice, participation, and co-production across multi-agency safeguarding arrangements (MASAs) in the North West of England.

It's a space for Safeguarding Partners to come together every 6 weeks to:

- Share challenges and collaborate on solutions
- Learn through themed provocations and hands-on tools
- Co-create stories, resources, and regional insights
- Build trust and alignment across local areas

WHO'S IT FOR?

The network is open to:

- Safeguarding Partners (or equivalent roles)
- One to two consistent representatives per area are encouraged to help build strong, ongoing connections.

Sessions are designed to be practical, people-focused, and supportive - no jargon, no silos, just progress.



WHAT TO EXPECT?

EACH 2-HOUR SESSION INCLUDES:

1

Check-In via Net Promoter Score (NPS)

We start with a quick reflection: "On a scale from -3 to +3, how well are we doing on voice locally right now?"

These scores are tracked over time to show changes in confidence, capability, and impact.

2

Live Problem-Solving Circle

1-2 MASAs present a real challenge around participation or co-production. Peers ask clarifying questions only to build shared understanding, then offer supportive reframes: "If I were in your shoes, I would..."

Tool of the Month

Each session highlights a practical resource from the Safeguarding Voices Toolkit - shared alongside real-world examples and live input from young people.

Live Story Harvest

We capture one compelling narrative each session to feed into regional storytelling, the toolkit, and wider system change.
